(Humphrey Avenue is north of Roosevelt Road in Oak Park, 60th Court is south of Roosevelt Road in Cicero)

The **Village of Oak Park**, **City of Berwyn**, and **Town of Cicero** have joined together to revitalize a key 1.25-mile segment of Roosevelt Road between Austin Boulevard and Harlem Avenue. As part of this effort, the municipalities are inviting property owners, business owners, residents and neighbors to an important meeting regarding streetscape design plans and zoning regulations for this portion of Roosevelt Road.

This multi-jurisdictional effort is expected to result in development of a streetscape design plan and new zoning regulations, both of which are intended to improve the appearance, accessibility and function of the corridor. At the May 28th meeting, the consultant team will present their preliminary findings about existing conditions and future possibilities along the corridor. Most important though, the municipalities and consultants will be there to answer your questions and listen to your thoughts, including your input on the following types of issues:

1. What types of improvements—sidewalk widening, lighting, landscaping, street furniture--would you recommend in order to make Roosevelt Road more attractive and pedestrian friendly street?
2. What would you suggest to help address traffic and parking issues on Roosevelt Road?
3. What types of uses and sizes of buildings are appropriate or desirable along this portion of Roosevelt Road?

If you can't join us on May 28th, we hope you will be able to join us at other meetings and events that will occur over the next few months.
